### **5** Conversions

 Affective Conversion happens when a person takes personal responsibility for his or her emotional healing and development. (covenant community)

>Psalm 147:3

>Do you have a recurring experience of emotion out of proportion to the situation?

>(tell story of kitchen table and marathon)

 Intellectual Conversion involves taking responsibility for the truth or falsity of one's beliefs by examining and testing them. (diverse community)

>John 7:41 (ordinary but also supposed to be from Bethlehem)

>Can you name one thing of consequence that you have changed your mind about in the last 3 years?

>joke about Saturday church...how about Penny as an elder?

>for me: political conservatism and Christianity are not the same thing

 Moral Conversion means being responsible to cultivate habits that embody the moral warehouse one has embraced and to live according to a broader social responsibility. (discipleship community)

>Matthew 5:48

>What is one example of hypocrisy in your life?

>joke about one of you finally made it, perfect!

>(tell story of making list in the summer of 1990)

>me now: physical stewardship and judging/cynical

 Sociopolitical Conversion involves accepting responsibility to seek the good for all humans and to work strategically with others to challenge and convert the wider world as well. (loving community)

>Matthew 20:28

>John 13:35

>What is one example during the last year when you put someone else's need ahead of your own, not counting children or spouse?

>(mention personal situations with our family...sacrifice always costs!)

>we are doing this as a church with 5<sup>th</sup> Saturdays!

 Religious Conversion\* begins by making a vow of devotion to Jesus and confessing Jesus' right to have authority over every aspect of my life. (Gospel community)

>John 1:12

>As you look back over the story of your life, can you find a moment when you made a vow of devotion to Jesus? -(show Welcome Home slide)
