Note: According to a 2010 survey by the National Association of Colleges and Employers, only 30.7 percent of graduating seniors without internship experience received a job offer after graduation compared to 42.3 percent among those with internships. Moreover, interns got higher salary offers, too—former interns were offered a median \$45,301 salary compared to \$34,601 among non-interns.
